# Reflections

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

The Vigil and First Mass of Easter reminds us of four truths, particularly well: Jesus Christ is the Light of the world; we are a people that have a history with God which is rooted in the Father's revelation of self to the Jews; in the waters of Baptism we are incorporated in the Body of Christ through our sacramental participation in Jesus death and resurrection, being made members of the company of the Saints; at God's Altar we are fed with the bread of life and the cup of salvation, the body and blood of Christ so that we might be His Body in the World, proclaiming the truth of God's power over all forces in creation, including death.

Ultimately the fifty days of Easter is a season of hope, joy and life, which is informed by light, word, water, bread and wine, all which are made extraordinary by the power of God. St. John Chrysostom said it best: "Come you all: Enter into the joy of your Lord. You the first and you the last, receive alike your reward. You rich and you poor, dance together. You strong and you weak, celebrate the day. You who have kept the fast and your who have not kept the fast rejoice today." I first heard this at the Russian Orthodox Cathedral in Chicago as an undergraduate. It was read from the center of the nave by Bishop Boris and it had a profound effect on me, bringing home that Easter is most profoundly a celebration of grace. We participate in the gifts of the Resurrection because that is God's desire and not because of anything we do or have done.

During these Fifty days of our Pascal Feast join with me in striving to understand the implications of God's Easter gift for the world and for ourselves. Allow this foretaste of paradise to inform your vision of creation and the gift which God makes to us daily through Christ's presence in the power of the Holy Spirit. Celebrate the new you that is being formed right now by the power of the Holy Spirit working in you and let the joy of the season enter all that you do, that we might all radiate the joy which God wishes to radiate through us.
