Reflections

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

One thing is needful – a living relationship with God. A relationship that drives us to value all aspects of life, particularly those encounters with our brothers and sisters made in the image of God. When we join the millions who share our faith in discovering this truth, every Eucharist becomes an opportunity to enter more deeply in a living relationship with God. Furthermore I hope all will be led to agree that the Eucharist and its attendant disciplines are preparation and sustenance for living. The God who pursues us uses every bit of creation and life to connect with us so that we may learn something about how God perceives human beings. As Rowan Williams, the 104th Archbishop of Canterbury, has written,

"Grace, for the Christian believer, is a transformation that depends in large part on knowing yourself to be seen in a certain way: as significant, as wanted. The whole story of creation, incarnation, and our incorporation into the fellowship of Christ's body tells us that God desires us, as if we were God, as if we were that unconditional response to God's giving that God makes in the life of the Trinity. We are created so that we may be caught up in this, so that we may grow into the wholehearted love of God by learning that God loves us as God loves God."

I believe that the Anglican vision, both modern and classical, play's a special role in reminding the world of this vision of grace. As Anglicans we are a peculiar extension of the life pursued by the early followers of Patrick of Ireland and Benedict of Nursia, father of western monasticism. Deeply rooted in the communal vision of the Desert Fathers, Benedict and Patrick understood that we are shaped by what we pay attention to. They understood that this is the path towards a sound and whole life. Because God longs for us we are given daily opportunities to be caught up in God's Song of Love. A love that created heaven and earth, a love that is recreating each of us into the person God imagines us to be; and a love that enables true familiarity and community, depending not on proximity or emotive connection but nearness to the One that Loves into Life. **WWIII**
