Reflections

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

The daily offices of Morning and Evening Prayer place us squarely in the context of the praying Church across the ages. It connects us with the faith of Jesus and the spirituality of the synagogue and the Temple. It sets us directly in the prayerful aspirations of the people called out by God through the ages as witnessed to in scripture and the history of the Church and most importantly, if we allow they can open us to the unexpected. The very structure of the daily offices reminds us that the best and only real approach to God is through humility and the cultivation of a receptive heart. The Psalmist brings this fact home to us time and time again if we have ears to hear. The great gospel canticles like the Song of Zechariah, the Song of Mary and the Song of Simeon are loaded with imagery of waiting on God and the required characteristic of humility. Daily the Church invites her children to wait upon God and thereby enter into true worship that can only be born of putting control aside and entering into the vision of God — a vision where the humble are lifted up and the mighty are humbled, a vision more about dwelling in God than seeking God to dwell in us.

By entering into a form that is centered on the prayerful and meditative, consideration of Scripture, the offices provides a place where we can be free from words and open to the space in between the words. Patience and perseverance are important attitudes to cultivate when we use the daily offices. Learning how to let them speak to us rather than applying an expectation of illumination can be one of the hardest mental and spiritual postures for modern western men and women to nurture. Surrender yourself to the well-worn ruts of the psalms and scripture reading, canticles, and prayers. Try to let them seep into your way of praying. Allow the pattern of the offices to inform your prayer rather than your perception of need or direction. It is often the case that real breakthroughs and moments of dénouement arrive when we least expect them. A passage from scripture which we have read many times over the course of the years takes on a new life and a fresh point of view which the pattern releases in the context of breathing the air of praise made genuine not by us but by the Holy Spirit. Furthermore prayers and petitions take on a connotation way beyond our paltry vision. In this way our Mother, the Church, infuses our acts of adoration, praise, thanksgiving, penitence, intercession and petition with the mystical power of the Word spoken out of silence and expands our sense of self and connectedness to the fullness of creation. **WWIII**
