Reflections

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

The Eucharist relies on the cultivation of humility. It introduces us to the whole story of creation, fall and redemption. To quote Professor Frances Young in her essay, 'The Great Thanksgiving Prayer': "It is a full-frontal facing up to the awful realities of sin, death and the judgment of God." Within this sense of "gonewrongness", the Eucharistic Prayer according to Professor Young, "is the shaping, the sense-making narrative, which gives us the content of our thanksgiving and makes sense of our lives." (Frances Young, *Living the Eucharist*, 2002, pg. 88) The Eucharist is the vehicle by which we are taken up into the worship of heaven and made part of that which is way beyond us. In the Eucharist we enter into the eternity of God's creation and become part of that which God realized in the person of Jesus Christ and dreams of realizing in all of us and creation.

The Eucharist is essentially a communal activity. It is the place where our personal prayer is forced to engage with the prayer of the Church. Beginning with the calendar, we are reminded that we are part of something greater than the current age or culture. The Collect of every Eucharist must always be thought of as the collective breath of the souls gathered and sighing Godward. The Prayers of the People urge us to intercede for the whole Church Catholic that mystical body fragmented by our sin; so we all might be one as Jesus and the Father are one. The Eucharistic Canon is a communal form of thanksgiving rooted in the sacrificial offering of Jesus on the cross, the goal of which is to make us more capable of opening our eyes to the love of the King of Glory. In the Eucharist we are asked to listen and to wait on God; so that the maker of heaven and earth might show us the way of community and consensus — always reminding us that personal discernment needs the confirmation of community grounded in the transcending relationship offered by God in the incarnation, through the crucifixion, in the power of the resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ.

In the Eucharist we encounter the glorious and the unmanageable possibilities of faith. Here we encounter God's desire to transfigure the world. Jesus and his bride the Church invite us to partake of the transformative life offered in the one sacrifice of Christ. God's yearning is that redemption; transformation and transfiguration may be realized in us and for us in the Eucharistic sacrifice. This encounter can only take place because God in Jesus Christ so longs for us that he will not give up the chase and there is no escape. (Jack Nicholls, *Living the Eucharist*, 2002, p. 75)
