Reflections

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

In my article last month I raised the topic of prayer. More specifically I talked about our own personal need to engage in the practice of prayer, "in the end it doesn't matter so much how you pray, but THAT you pray". In this month's article I want to explore a little deeper why that matters.

In our Baptism we are knit into the body of Christ and set upon a journey whose goal is union with God. That gift is given to us not because of any merit, action or confession on our part. It is wholly and utterly a gift of God given to us in love and grace with an invitation to deepen the depth of that gift through our participation in the Sacraments – most particularly the Eucharist – and which is actualized in prayer, "a lifting up of the mind and heart to God" as St. John Damascene puts it.

The practice of regular daily prayer, (including adoration, contrition, thanksgiving, intercession, petition, and silence/listening) forms and shapes our everyday actions so that slowly, over time, our life is molded toward a certain purpose or end. And what is that purpose or end? A recognition that we are created by God, we are created for God, and our hearts will be forever restless until we find our rest in returning to the one who made us, to union with the one who loved us into being.

One of the things we talk about and aspire to is to be aware of the myriad ways which in our everyday lives God surrounds us with opportunities to experience his grace and presence. Yet the busyness of our lives often keeps us from seeing and experiencing that for which we so desperately long. When we cultivate prayer, when adoration becomes as natural to us as breathing, we learn to recognize God not only when bread and wine become Body and Blood, but in "the glory of a sunset, the beauty of a bird, the majesty of the sea and the wonder of the simplest creatures" (Harton). In other words, everything that surrounds us becomes an opportunity to recognize and be amazed by God's loving presence all around us. That is one of the great mysteries of the Sacraments, through ordinary, material means God works extraordinary, mysterious grace. Through our prayer and adoration, we open ourselves to be used for those same ends. And it is only through the regular, life-long cultivation of that awareness that we can see God's presence even amid "the changes and chances of this life." **Fr. Charles**
