Reflections

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

St. Paul's has one of the oldest chapters of the Daughters of the King in the Diocese of Georgia. It has been actively involved in the establishment of other Chapters. The Daughters of the King is an order for lay or ordained women, who, by the reaffirmation of the promises made at baptism, pledge themselves to a lifelong program of prayer, service, and evangelism dedicated to strengthening the spiritual life of her parish. The object of the order is the extension of Christ's Kingdom and the building up of the Body. Members of the Daughters undertake a rule of life which incorporates prayer and service.

The Rule of Prayer and the Rule of Service are the cornerstones of the Daughters life. Every member has a daily rule of prayer. This includes as part of it, praying daily for the spread of Christ's Kingdom, especially among women and girls; for God's blessing upon the members of the Order; for the spiritual growth of the parish and for the clergy of the parish to which the chapter owes allegiance. By adopting a rule of Service, a Daughter seeks daily to do the will of God where she is, remembering the words of Jesus: "In as much as ye have do it unto one of the least of these... ye have done it unto me." Matt: 25:40. It is the application of one's baptismal vows, reaffirmed by confirmation: including being Christ's faithful servant in the extension of His Kingdom; taking part regularly in the worship, study and work of the Church; and rendering aid always to the Rector as deemed necessary for the spiritual up-building of the parish.

Both Rules are meant give strength and help to the Daughters in the living into the object the order - the extension of Christ's Kingdom. Each Daughter promises to make a conscientious and constant effort to present Jesus Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit in such a way that other persons may be led to believe in Him as Savior and follow Him as Lord within the fellowship of the Church. Practically this means reaching out to those who are new in the community and looking for a church home, to those in hospitals, to shut-ins, and to those in sorrow or personal trouble. It also means helping new Episcopalians experience God's love through the fellowship of the Church.

The vision statement of the Daughters of the King provides an important insight into the role which is theirs in the Church. "As Daughters of the King we are women of courage who have made a commitment to serve God our King. We wear crosses as an outward and visible sign that we cannot live a day without Christ in our lives. We see our Order as a community of nurturing women, accepting all people, bridging differences and cherishing traditions. Moving toward the 21st century, empowered by the Holy Spirit, our vision is to encourage and enable all to be reflections of God's love, reaching out through prayer, service and evangelism to spread His Kingdom."

Honey Creek Future Fund
