REFLECTIONS

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Is your giving to the life work and witness of the Church left to chance? How do you determine what you will give? Have you been giving the same amount for the last decade even though you have been blessed with a greater abundance of resources in the interim? Are you one of those who investigate their wallets and selects a bill and gives it? Or do you give what is left over at the end of the month after the bills are paid and you have done everything else? In times of economic uncertainty do you allow fear to govern your spending decisions, including your giving to the Church? Is the Parish Church just another charity in the long line of contributions that are solicited from you each year? Or does your giving resemble a dues approach which considers only the parameters of maintenance and survival and not the challenges of growth and outreach?

If any of the above ring a bell or sound familiar you are denying yourself one of the greatest gifts of the Christian life. Ultimately Stewardship of the gifts which are ours by God's grace is about life and our journey into it. Stewardship is a way of living. It is about deciding before any thing else that we are going to give the first portion of what God has given to us to the work of building the Kingdom of God and learning to live on the abundance of God's grace. It is also a practical tool for daily living because it forces us to be intentional about our money and its use. Stewardship traditionally challenges us to live on 90%. Many people over the ages have found that giving 10% to the work of the Church frees them from the tyranny of money and allows them to make better choices with the 90%.

The Church and Her call to each and every one of us to be good stewards of what we control reminds us of the proper order of things in this life - God is the creator and owner of all things and we have been give dominion, that is authority and responsibility over it. This means we will be held accountable for that which has been given into our hands, therefore it follows the greater the gifts the higher the responsibility. In this way Stewardship is also about the life to come. And the standard of measure will be how did we use our gifts to serve God's children and Creation.

Let everything be done decently and in order. This was the motto of the New Testament Church. Our liturgies continue to reflect this vision in the way we worship and honor God. Giving is part of worship. Let it be done in an orderly fashion. A grateful portion of our income should be set aside each week or month and given to God's Work. Furthermore, our pledges should reflect our understanding and wrestling with the demands which God's gifts present us. When we attempt to apply just such insights to our giving behavior, we will not only feel more satisfied with our giving but it will be a reflection of our willingness to make God a part of all that we are and all that we have. **WWIII**
