Reflections

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Time in Church with the intention of seeking God's will in difficult times can bring proper perspective to the challenges and fears of everyday life. It can give the heart time to convert the head, allowing the whole person to benefit from intimations of the holy which have come our way in the course of doing the things that we normally do. This may involve going to a particular corner or Altar where articulated prayer, reflection and meditation take place. It can also be as simple as grabbing a moment in a place set apart for the glory of God that conspires to capture our attention and allowing it to speak of God whose love desires our love.

These moments are not limited to Church but the holy other of Church can help make sense of those moments in life when the Holy is attempting to break in. I have experienced such in sweet conversation with a loved one, or in the discordant tones of a Shostakovich Piano Concerto in the Cappella at St. Petersburg. I have also been visited by the hint of the universal during such diverse activities as saying the rosary while exercising my dog in the park and making a Maundy Thursday pilgrimage to seven altars of repose, where we are invited to watch one hour with our Lord in His Blessed Sacrament. They all have in common the rarified particularity of a physical place set aside and dedicated to the One who created and sustains us.

Regular participation in the Church's offering of Mass backed up and expanded by visitations to the Blessed Sacrament are glorious opportunities to integrate the comings and goings of daily life with the greater life of God. If you have not been to Church in a while, come and remember, remember to cultivate an intimation of the glorious possibilities offered for transformation and transfiguration in this marvelous gift which is ours as catholic Christians, the blessed sacrament of our Lord's Body and Blood. By adoring and making our communions in real time and space, it becomes easier to apprehend a hint of the possibility of all things being made whole in Christ Jesus – the world, our nation and ourselves. **WWIII**
