REFLECTIONS

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Saturday, June 22nd the Zabriske Memorial Church of St. John the Evangelist in Newport, Rhode Island will host the Annual Meeting of the Confraternity of the Blessed Sacrament. As many of you know the Confraternity was established in 1862 to honor the Presence of Our Lord in the Sacrament and to promote appropriate preparation and devotion to the Holy Eucharist.

At the heart of the Christian faith lies the Blessed Sacrament of the altar. It is at the altar that the outward and visible sign of God's inward and spiritual grace is conveyed by means of Christ's Body and Blood. Here we share in the divine life through the gift of God's Son, Jesus Christ. Associates of the Confraternity of the Blessed Sacrament strive to promote reverence for Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist through the witness of their lives and words, through prayer and teaching. They undertake to pray for one another at the Eucharist and to make careful preparation for the Holy Communion, including the observance of the Eucharistic Fast (in accordance with modern custom) and the use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession). The Confraternity also provides grants of vessels and vestments for celebrating the Eucharist and reserving the Blessed Sacrament to poor parishes at home and abroad.

The Confraternity is a devotional society which promotes careful attention to Preparation before and Thanksgiving after, every Communion. Its members are encouraged to make one or more of the following at every Eucharistic celebration they are part of: Acts of Faith, of Adoration, of Spiritual Communion, of Thanksgiving, of Reparation, of Intercession, or of Prayer for the Visible Unity of the Church.

Membership consists of Communicants, Bishops Priests, and Deacons of both sexes who are practicing Catholics and members of, or in communion with the Episcopal Church and concur with the Objects Rules, Recommendations and Laws of the Confraternity. An Applicant may be admitted as a member by a Priest Associate or the Secretary-General upon the proper recommendation of a member of the Confraternity or fervent desire of the applicant.

Members are expected to make Offerings, according to their ability, to the General Fund of the Confraternity, and to provide for the publication of the Intercession Paper by an annual subscription. They are also encouraged to join the Parish Ward, or if there is not one, to register with the general list.

OBJECTS OF THE CONFRATERNITY

1. The Honor due the PERSON of our LORD JESUS CHRIST in the BLESSED SACRAMENT of HIS BODY and BLOOD. 2. Mutual and special Intercession at the time of and in union with the EUCHARISTIC SACRIFICE. 3. The promotion of the observance of the Catholic and primitive practice of receiving the Holy Communion fasting.

RULES

1. To Communicate or at least to be present, on Sundays and the greater Festivals and other Holy days, when the HOLY EUCHARIST is Celebrated, unless prevented by sickness or other urgent cause. 2. To promote, by all legitimate means, frequent and reverent Celebrations of the HOLY EUCHARIST, as the Chief Act of Divine Service. 3. To make such special Intercession as shall be from time to time directed. 4. To observe the discipline of Fasting Communion according to present Catholic Custom. **If you are interested in becoming part of this witness of faith talk to me about becoming a member. WWII**
