### REFLECTIONS

#### Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

Our Annual Parish Meeting and the celebration of the solemnity of our Patronal Feast, the Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle made its yearly return this past Sunday. It is always important that we look at where we have been during the past year in the life work and witness of the Parish. It is even more important that we consider our future together as the people called to do the work of God in this Place, in this community, in this City and in our Diocese. Our is a lively call and ministry in our common life driven by the gifts of the Baptized. Bishop Bengasi moves into the last months of his leadership as our Diocesan. We will soon be creating in concert with our new Bishop a vision for the coming decade. Like so many of the years in the recent past we continue to navigate rough seas of economic and political turmoil. I have said at other times this is part and parcel of the greater context in which we are called to do ministry. One image is always sufficient if we allow it to direct our common work and our vision - and that is the image of the Cross. By it our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ has won the world and has triumphed over sin and death. To the extent that we are willing and able (that is willing to be enabled and to enable each other) in picking up our cross each day and following our LORD the Kingdom is ours and the world will be transformed.

To my mind the greatest and most perfect expression by St. Paul our patron of the conversion we are all called to is summed up in his First Letter to the Corinthians, chapter 13, verses 1-13. It is here that we meet the most incredible definition of Love, the Love can keep us in union with each other and moving in the right direction. "Love is patient; love is kind and envies no one. Love is never boastful, nor conceited, nor rude; never selfish, not quick to take offense. Love keeps no score of wrongs; does not gloat over other's sins but delights in the truth. There is nothing that love cannot face; there is no limit to its faith, its hope, its endurance." What we all need is a conversion of heart and mind which mirrors these words and just as Paul did not live into them over night neither shall we. But perseverance and a willingness to die to self can be powerful tools in the hands of a Loving God.

Paul went on to remind us that, "now we only see puzzling reflections in a mirror, ... our knowledge at best is only partial", but a time and a place exists in God where we shall see face to face and our knowledge will be whole, just like God's knowledge of us. It is to this Place that all our strivings need to be directed with full purpose of heart and in great humility. Remember that the fullness of truth is in God, who's Holy Spirit is His own first gift for those who believe. It is in this context that we might complete God's work in the world and bring to fulfillment the sanctification of all.

We must remember that Jesus brought light and life in the midst of controversy. That he got in trouble because he challenged myopic religious practices and positions that hurt people. He put light on the fact that we often keep tradition in a way that rejects the commandment of God (see Mark 7:9: "How well you set aside the commandment of God in order to maintain your tradition!") this is hard for us to hear but to follow in the footsteps of Jesus is to find oneself in the midst of turmoil. To escape the discomfort of tension is to forsake Jesus in favor of our will and comfort. As for me I struggle to choose daily to follow such a Christ, rather than a picture of a Jesus who is less challenging. (to be continued) **WWIII**
